
How to Convert a Video into Documentation Using Make-A Doc

Hi, this is Matt at Make-A-Doc. Today, I will demonstrate how to convert a video into a simple tutorial or documentation.

1. Logging In and Accessing the Dashboard


To begin, log in to your Make-A-Doc account by clicking the login button. Once logged in, you will arrive at the dashboard.

2. Understanding Tickets and Conversion Limits


At the bottom of the dashboard, you can see the number of tickets you currently have. When you register for Make-A-Doc, you are provided with three standard tickets. Each ticket allows you to convert a five-minute video into documentation. Note that the output is only available in English, and customization is not possible.

3. Starting a New Video Conversion

To start a new conversion, select your video by clicking on it. Once selected, click 'Send' to upload the video. After uploading, you can monitor the conversion process in the dashboard.




Dashboard displaying the video processing status after starting the conversion.

4. The Conversion Process

The conversion process involves several steps:

- Extracting the audio to convert it into text.
- Generating thumbnails and evaluating which thumbnail works best at specific moments in the video.
- Cleaning up speech issues to ensure clarity, so you can focus on presenting without needing a script.


Once these steps are completed, the system compiles everything into a package that includes screenshots, an HTML page, a PDF, and the text transcript of your documentation.

5. Accessing and Managing Your Documentation


Once the conversion is complete, the video disappears from the processing queue and appears in the 'My Docs' section. You can access this section by clicking 'My Docs' at the top of the dashboard. Here, you will find the results of your documentation.



The completed video appears in the 'My Docs' section after processing is finished.

6. Downloading Your Documentation


In the 'My Docs' section, you can preview your documentation. While editing is not allowed at this stage, you can download the documentation as a zip package to your computer.



The 'My Docs' section allows users to view their documentation, with a clear option to download it as a zip package.
